SNIPPETS FROM THE PAST

From the minutes of the Meeting of Mottisfont Parish Council dated 27 May 1982, Chairman, Mr A Sykes:



"The Clerk reported that the National Trust were not keen to have the bus shelter moved nearer to the Abbey gates. Clerk requested to continue negotiations for another site in the village.

The Clerk read a letter from the Broughton School Governors asking for Parish Council support in requesting that the Broughton catchment area include Mottisfont, which was agreed.

The Chairman reported that the National Trust had agreed in principle, to a 'full repairing lease' being granted to the Parish Council for 21 years at £25 per year, but this must be confirmed by their local committee.

Clerk reported on negotiations so far with HCC for purchase of equipment at the school. It is possible for the village to buy the temporary classroom, but the National Trust would like it to be removed. However, the dining hut can remain.


We have decided to move our meetings to the Village Hall, so the February meeting will be on Wednesday 28th Feb at 7.30pm in the small room at the Village Hall.
