Southern Water Highways Drainage Charge, Dunbridge

The Parish Council has unfortunately been unsuccessful in getting any reduction in the Drainage Charge levied in Dunbridge. Despite writing to the Chief Executive, the answer is that Southern Water is directly responsible for the treatment and disposal of the wastewater for the properties in question, and this is why the charge is raised for both the wastewater and the highways drainage. The fact that the system they are responsible for is a rather sub-standard one obviously does not come into it.

BT proposal to remove public telephone kiosks

The Parish Council wrote a letter to meet the initial deadline in July. It is opposed to the removal of the two kiosks in our parish due to the very poor or non-existent mobile phone reception in this area and their vital need in emergency situations. Figures showing the low usage of the kiosks have now been supplied by BT, and the deadline for consultation extended into August. This will be further discussed by the Parish Council but a further letter explaining, among other things, that the low usage is in no small part due to their conversion from cash to card is likely to be sent.

Village Centre Speed Limit

It is now planned to bring this scheme into operation in the first two weeks of September, and to coincide with a campaign to raise awareness and encourage compliance. The Parish Council is waiting to hear from Hampshire County Council's Road Safety Team with the details.

A limited number of day tickets to fly-fish for trout on the Mottisfont Estate are available at £20 each (market price is £250!) to anyone living or working in the parish of Mottisfont. One per applicant. You must have some fly-fishing experience, and have a current Environment Agency rod licence (£3.50 for 1 day - available from Post Offices or online). Under 16's must be accompanied at all times by an adult.

Beginners

Villagers new to fly-fishing can learn the basics of casting and fly selection from the National Trust on a date to be arranged. Rods and lines etc supplied. Minimum age 12. You will need to bring polarised sunglasses for safety. £10 each, and limited places – first come first served!
