# MOTTISFONT RETURNS TO THE STONE AGE

Villagers will have the chance to experience stone age art first hand at an archaeology course being run at the village hall. The course is called Ancient Art, and is part of a new business based in Mottisfont called Time Hunters.

Ancient Art is a complete stone age experience! In

the morning, equipment is made and pigments mixed, using authentic materials and techniques. In the afternoon, a piece of art is created – stone age style. Inspiration is taken from the stunning works of art created by our ancestors.

The course is relaxed, and the day aims to be an enjoyable experience and a chance to try new

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skills.

Lunch is provided, and refreshments are available throughout the day. The lunch has a stone age theme – with the ingredients all things our ancestors would recognise. They are sourced from either local or small producers who are passionate about the food they produce.

## The Thomas Dowse Trust

The Thomas Dowse Trust was created to provide people up to the age of 25 years with financial assistance towards educational requirements. The Trust meets four times a year (March, June, September and November) to award grants to those who show a need for financial assistance towards their education, whether it be for Pre-School, School, College or University.

The next Trust meeting will be held in September. All applications for the September meeting must be submitted to the Secretary, Mrs Christine Hoskins, The Old Thatch, High Street, Broughton, no later than the end of August. Any application received after this date will be carried forward to the next meeting in November 2009.

## St Andrew's Parish Church Mottisfont Gift Day - Saturday, 12th September, 10am to 1pm

Dear Parishioner,

I am including an early reminder of our Gift Day this month as there is no September edition and in August many people are away. Therefore now is my chance to grab your attention!

I am sure you will agree with me that our ancient and beautiful church of St Andrew's is a place of tranquillity, beauty and history. It is a holy place, which reminds us of the transcendent love of God for us. It is a place steeped in prayer and village life stretching back into the history of many centuries, and its presence goes back even beyond the foundation of Mottisfont Abbey. What a gem we have in St Andrew's!

The miracle is that St Andrew's is still today at the heart of prayer for our village and for the world, and of Christian worship Sunday by Sunday.

Besides the rhythm of weekly worship, there are many other important milestones when only our Parish Church will do. There are the happy times of Baptisms and Weddings and, inevitably, the sad occasions when the ministry of the Church is needed to bring hope and support at times of death and bereavement.

In order to keep our church maintained, open and functioning costs some £19,000 per annum. Oil, electricity, insurance, cemetery upkeep, repairs, etc., exceed £5,000 per annum, plus Ministry Quota at £14,000. You can imagine with only a small congregation that this is an increasingly difficult task. It is becoming progressively more difficult to fund, even with our loyal congregation who are both giving, and holding all sorts of functions



in order to keep a "roof over our heads". It says in scripture that the more generous we are, the more we will receive back in so many other ways. Therefore may I ask if you would consider making an annual donation to St Andrew's, in the form of a weekly or monthly Standing Order?

We are holding our Mottisfont Church Gift Day on Saturday, 12th September, from 10am to 1.00 pm. I will be in church, and would be delighted to meet you and receive any donation you may wish to make. Please place your donation in an envelope, including your name and address, and either hand to me on the day or if you are unable to attend or wish to give an anonymous donation please send it to me. It will be gratefully received, and I will hand it to our Church Treasurer to help her to keep the bills paid.

Please help. It is our church, and we want to keep it open for all our village people.

I very much look forward to meeting with you on our Gift Day.

# SPEED REDUCTION TO 30MPH ON OUR STRETCH OF THE B3084

the June issue of Acorn, regarding the existing speed limit of 40mph being too fast along our stretch of the B3084 (Hatt Hill and Spearywell Road) for villagers and visitors to walk or cycle along in safety. Many of you shared my concerns and would like to see a change to 30mph as soon as possible. Villagers 30 have said that they find the road very daunting, especially when walking with children, and some even refuse to walk along it at all. In recent months there has been a steady increase in very long HGVs using the road

making negotiating it on foot even more hazardous - all the more reason for having a 30mph speed limit.

Please take a moment of your time to write to the Parish Council, before 15th July, which is the date of the next Parish Council meeting, and ask them to lobby to get the village a 30mph speed limit along the stretch of the B3084 from Spearywell Farm, along Spearywell Road, and down Hatt Hill to join the existing 30mph speed

The Broughton and Mottisfont Village Bus Committee has reluctantly had to increase fares from 1st April, 2009, to take account of increasing running costs - particularly maintenance. The new fares will be as shown below. Remember - your FarePass is valid on these scheduled journeys. Note that children under 5 are carried free of charge, and there is no service on public holidays.

For Group Hire the charge has increased to £1.60 per mile. The Committee wishes to point out what a favourable rate this is for local community groups. Fill the bus and it works out at a very reasonable price.
