## Did Michael leave the tap on again?



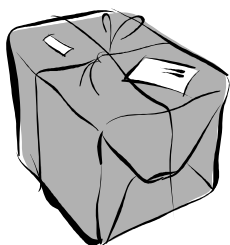
No, it was a water leak in the pavement outside Michael and Jacquie Horne's house on Mill Rise, which also caused the electricity failure on Monday, 2nd April.

The high pressure water escaping from the burst pipe washed out a cavity through which the power cable ran. Stones propelled at high speed by the water soon cut into the electricity cable, causing the power to be off for some hours over a wide area.

A mobile generator was used to restore power while the damage was repaired over the next couple of days.

## ARE YOU UNDER 25 YEARS OF AGE?

If you are, and you live in the village you might be eligible for a grant from The Thomas Dowse Trust.

The Trust was set up to help those under the age of 25 years of age with grants for educational purposes. This could be for pre-school, school, college or university. You might need extra books, perhaps a school trip or help towards a further or higher education course. Grants are normally in the region of £50-200.

Anyone under 25 living in the ancient parishes of Broughton, Bossington and Mottisfont can apply. The Trust meets four times a year and the next meeting will be at the end of May. Applications for the next round of grants should be in by the middle of May.

Why not come and join us to enjoy a surprising blend of musical variety with this stunning Male Voice Choir and the supporting voices of the Romsey Youth Choir. Compere for the evening will be Alexis Green, of BBC South Today. Tickets are limited so please apply for yours today.

Chief Executive of Hampshire and Isle of Wight Air Ambulance, John Perry said 'I'm sure this will prove to be a wonderful evening of music and celebration with one of the county's best loved Male Voice Choirs. We are honoured to have them perform for us in the historic setting of the Great Hall, and I feel sure all those who attend the performance will enjoy it enormously. All proceeds from the evening will go towards helping us raise the £3,600 needed each day to keep the Air Ambulance flying and saving lives. We receive no government funding and rely on the generosity of the people of Hampshire and the Isle of Wight to maintain the service.'

HIOWAA provides Air Ambulance services across Hampshire and the Isle of Wight in response to emergency calls. Since the Air Ambulance became operational on 1st July 2007 it has undertaken over 3560 missions, many of which have saved lives, and flies seven days per week, being called to missions many times per day.

As a charity, HIOWAA only receives help through secondment of paramedics from the NHS. To keep the Air Ambulance flying we need to raise over £3600 per day. This is only possible through the wonderful public support we receive from the people of Hampshire and the Isle of Wight.

## MEDITERRANEAN NEW POTATO AND CHICKEN BAKE

Use Jersey Royals, everyone's favourite spring time potato, in this recipe and savour that rich buttery taste. This recipe serves six as a simple lunch or light supper. Try adding some salad and garlic bread to make the meal more substantial.

### Ingredients

1kg of new potatoes, washed  
A little salt  
1 small aubergine, roughly chopped  
1 small courgette, roughly chopped  
1 small red pepper, roughly chopped  
1 medium red onion, peeled & sliced  
2 teaspoons of minced garlic (about 4 cloves)  
50g of pine nuts  
2 teaspoons of dried Provencale herbs  
Olive oil  
Salt & black pepper  
1 large (800g) tin of chopped tomatoes  
4 chicken breasts (approx. 225g (8oz) each), cooked  
1 teaspoon of dried oregano  
150g of parmesan cheese shavings

### How to make it

Firstly, par-boil the new potatoes in slightly salted water for a few minutes. Drain and allow to cool.

Now cut the smaller new potatoes in half and the larger ones into thick slices, then put them into a baking tray (approx. 36cm/14" x 26cm/10"). Add the vegetables (aubergine, courgette, red pepper & red onion) along with the garlic and pine nuts to the baking tray. Sprinkle over the Provencale herbs with a generous drizzle of olive oil. Toss the potatoes and vegetables together in the tray. Season well with salt and pepper.

Cover with foil and bake for 20 minutes at 200°C (180°C fan)/Gas Mark 6. Then bake for a further 20 minutes uncovered.

Cut the cooked chicken breasts into thick slices. Now add the chopped tomatoes and cooked chicken to the tray. Mix in well and return the tray to the oven for 10 minutes.

Finally, sprinkle over the oregano and parmesan shavings and bake for 5 minutes until the cheese has melted. Serve hot.
