# The ACORN signs up to Leveson guidelines

After consulting its legal advisors, the management of the *Acorn* has made a bid for the moral high ground by voluntarily signing up to guidelines to press behaviour proposed by the Leveson enquiry.

The idea of bugging Parish Council meetings (anything to avoid actually attending) will from now on be deprecated, as will selling the tapes to the highest bidder, even though no actual sales were ever achieved.

A tougher line will be taken over redacting articles submitted for publication in the *Acorn*. However, this is not without its difficulties. One of our regular contributors said, "How can I when I now can't even ?

The new guidelines come into force on 1st April.

The daffodils are starting to bloom, and the sheep have come back to the paddock, so it's the ideal time to come for a spring walk around the grounds. We've got a new spring trail for families to follow, and there's lots to do during the holidays.

#### Eggs marks the spot!

Join us over Easter (29th March to 1st April) for some family fun involving chocolate, detective work and your imagination. The mysterious Easter bird has hidden her eggs around the grounds but the rain has washed all their patterns away! Help us to redecorate the eggs so she can find them again, and see if you can recreate what the Easter bird looks like as you complete your trail and claim your Cadbury's egg prize (trails £2 per child, including chocolate egg).

On Monday, 1st April, we'll be taking part in the nation's Big Egg and Spoon Race. Line up at the start and see if you can go round the complete assault course without dropping your egg! Don't forget to bring your spoon...

#### Behind the scenes at Mottisfont

Visitors to Mottisfont can now catch enticing glimpses of what goes on in the house and gardens behind closed doors and after hours, through the eyes of artist-in-residence Anna Cady and the actions of staff and volunteers.

Anna's unique installation, hidden within picture frames and books in Mottisfont's house, were created using a remarkable point-of-view camera. This was attached by a harness to staff and volunteers to reveal the work that goes on away from visitors' eyes. In a house and garden full of hidden layers and unseen activity, the installation reveals a completely new perspective on life at Mottisfont.

Anna, whose film 30% was accepted for the International Documentary Shorts section of this year's Sundance Film Festival, is the first artist to exhibit her work through Mottisfont's 'Place for Art' project. This two year programme (funded by Arts Council England and a number of other charitable trusts) will showcase the work of six artists-inresidence. Each one will spend three months at the property, involving staff, volunteers and local community groups in creating art that tells some of the unseen stories of Mottisfont.

Anna explains "When a member of staff or volunteer at Mottisfont agrees to film their working process for me, I walk away and leave the camera in their hands. I have absolutely no idea what will be recorded until later that day when I download the files, which are a gift. A gift which I truly respect because every single piece of film reveals that person's love of their work and the very special place they work in."

"Anna's work reveals some unique and surprising images, and we hope visitors will be fascinated by what they see", said Louise Govier, Mottisfont's Visitor Experience and Communities Manager. "The results are both entertaining and insightful, and it's been wonderful to see such beauty in everyday chores, some of which even the staff didn't know happened!"

As part of her creative process, Anna also worked with Andover Young Carers as they made their own pinhole cameras and photographed Mottisfont. They used the point-of-view camera to make a film that shows how to do pinhole photography, and worked with community-led film group City Eye in Southampton to edit a finished version. Both the film and the group's beautiful, ghostly photographs are also now on show at Mottisfont.

The installation, entitled Forever, For Everyone, is on show at Mottisfont every day until 3rd November. To find out more about Anna's work at Mottisfont, have a look at her blog:

## **Rector's Letter for April 2013**

Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of angels! Exult, all creation around God's throne! Exult, all creation around God's throne! Jesus Christ, our King, is risen! Sound the trumpet of salvation!

These are the powerful words which form part of the Easter Liturgy known as the Exsultet.

They encompass in this part of the liturgy the potent witness that when Christ was raised from the dead he lifted not only humanity from sin and death but also his touch was on all creation itself to the point where creation is called to burst into praise at the eternal transforming event of new creation and Easter. Psalm 148 is also a wonderful prayer of praise as it declares: *Praise the Lord from the heavens; praise him in the heights above. Praise him, all his angels; praise him, all his heavenly hosts. Praise him, sun and moon; praise him, all you shining stars. Praise him, you highest heavens and you waters above the skies.* 

Here within Easter Day the whole of Christ's mission of salvation is concentrated as we meet to celebrate His Resurrection from the Dead! We meet to celebrate the love for which we were created as it works to transform the brokenness of humanity into the wholeness of Christ. "Late have I loved you, beauty so old and so new," wrote Augustine in his Confessions. As a young man St.



Augustine had sought love in many places and things, and people. Why? Because he knew that he was made to love and be loved...he eventually found his answers in the One who is Love, Jesus Christ.

In the Old Testament to see God was to die, in the New Testament to see God in Christ is to live, and to live eternally from the moment of recognition from our finite existence. The 31st of March this year is Easter Day and the celebrations throughout the Benefice will begin with a sunrise Eucharist at Nutley Farm, Salisbury Road then throughout the morning Benefice Easter Services will be taking place.

Please join us as we meet to celebrate Easter in our services throughout the Benefice.




## **KIMBRIDGE RESTAURANT**

## Orange and passion fruit posset

This recipe serves 6 people.

#### Ingredients:

3 oranges, zest and juice
900ml double cream, plus extra for decoration
250g caster sugar
3 passion fruit
2 leaves of gelatine or 1 sachet of gelatine granules

#### How to make it:

You will need six champagne flutes or something similar to put the posset in.

Grate the zest of the oranges using the fine side of the grater, and place into a saucepan with the cream. Gently heat and simmer for 5 minutes.

Place the sugar and the juice together in a bowl and mix together. Add this mixture to the pan and bring back to the simmer. Once the cream mixture is hot, poor into another bowl and mix together until the sugar has dissolved.

When the mixture has cooled, cut the passion fruit in half, scrape out the seeds and add into the mixture. Next, pour the mixture into the glasses and place in the fridge to set for a minimum of 5 hours overnight is best. Whip a small amount of cream and pipe in a swirl onto the top of the set posset.

To make the biscuit, soften the butter in the microwave, but do not melt it. In a mixing bowl, combine the flour and sugar together and then add the butter. Mix together until it becomes a smooth dough.

Now roll the dough into a sausage shape about 2cm deep and wrap in cling film. Chill for 1 hour. Once chilled, remove the dough from the fridge, cut into biscuit-sized pieces and place them on a baking tray lined with parchment paper. Bake them for 7 minutes on 180°C (160°C fan)/Gas Mark 4 to 5 or until the shortbread starts to go golden around the edge.

Once removed from the oven and while still hot, sprinkle with caster sugar and leave to cool. Once cold serve a biscuit with each posset.


The club is very well situated in the heart of the village, welcoming families and offering a friendly face and reasonably priced bar.
