Toilet Design and Your New Water Metering Bill: A Timely Warning!

While researching dual low flush toilets that are currently available, I became somewhat alarmed at the reliability issues with the majority of these products, as with very recent few exceptions, nearly all use dual flush valves, controlled via a button press, or sensor.

These can save water until the valves become faulty, when they don't fail-safe, leaking water continually down through the pan, resulting in a rather high water bill after 6 months. It appears that this has only become a real issue since 1999, when valve operated systems were legalised.

Prior to that (from 1863) the only toilet design that was legal in the UK used the great British siphon (identified by a lever to operate it), which has two key advantages: consistency and reliability over the long-term, because siphons, unlike valves, are inherently leak-free and normally fail-safe. They are also more familiar to UK plumbers and are cheaper and easier to repair.

To commence 5th January 2014 at 6pm

In consultation with the other member parishes of our Benefice, some reorganisation of Sunday services has been agreed to facilitate the individual needs of each parish. There is little change to the service pattern at St Andrews, Mottisfont, with the exception of the first Sunday each month. Instead of the 11am Matins service we are reintroducing the very lovely service of Evensong. This 6pm service at the closing of the day is a calming and peaceful way to reflect on the weekend, and to collect ourselves in preparation for the week ahead thoughtfully, prayerfully and with thankfulness. It will be a regular monthly event on the first Sunday of the month.

I hope many will be glad to see the rekindling of this much loved service, a service that perhaps many of us recollect from years gone by, or from our childhood. Evensong is especially wonderful in the summertime with the light evenings, and it is unfortunate that its re-launching just happens to be in midwinter. Who knows, we may be snow bound by then! Lets hope not.

The good news, however, is that if you would like to attend but need help with transport, we will do our best to organise lifts door to door. All you need to do is call me on the number below.

Refreshments will be offered at the end of the service, and on 5th January there will be a seasonal glass of mulled wine.

KIMBRIDGE RESTAURANT

Dark Chocolate and Amaretto Cheesecake

This recipe serves 8 people.

Ingredients

200g melted dark chocolate 400g full fat soft cheese 50g amaretto 1 packet of amaretto biscuits (150g) 50g melted butter 100g double cream



How to make it

Kate Buchan, Sous Chef at Kimbridge Restaurant

Grease the edges of an 8 inch loose bottomed tin and line with baking paper. Put the amaretto biscuits in

a blender and blitz until all broken up. Alternatively, put the biscuits in a sealed bag and hit with a rolling pin until all broken up.

Melt the butter and mix the crushed biscuits and butter together, placing evenly in the bottom of the tin. Then put the tin in the fridge to chill whilst making the filling.

Put the cream cheese in a mixer and mix until soft. Add the cream and the amaretto to loosen the cheese. Once thoroughly mixed, melt the dark chocolate and leave to cool slightly. When cool, pour it into the cheese mix and gently combine the two. Taste, and if not sweet enough, you can add a little icing sugar.

Retrieve the base from the fridge and place the cheesecake mix on top of the biscuit base. Knock the tin gently on the table top so that any air at the bottom is removed.

Once the mix is spread evenly, put the cheesecake back into the fridge and chill overnight for best results. Then remove the cheesecake from the tin, discard the paper lining and using a hot clean knife, cut the cheesecake into portions, wiping the knife each time so you get a clean cut.
