COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH SCHEME

You often tell us that speeding is one of the biggest community concerns in your respective areas. With this in mind, we are working closely with parish councils to try to purchase speed checking equipment.

Community Speed Watch will be co-ordinated by Hampshire Constabulary in partnership with your local council and other agencies. The scheme will be run by our local police Safer Neighbourhood Police team and community volunteers, and will only operate on roads with a speed limits of 20, 30 and 40 From the Romsey Rural Police Weekly Crime update mph.

Parish Council News

Village Bus

The village bus will be pulling into Mill Rise for a six month trial period to pick up residents, after which the village bus committee will consider if this is to be a permanent arrangement. We hope this will be much safer and convenient for residents. On the subject of waiting for the bus, County Councillor Andrew Gibson has awarded the parish a grant to pay for a new seat at Mill Rise. The grant will also cover the installation costs.

Faster Broadband

Hampshire County Council is continuing to work towards providing 90% of the rural areas with faster broadband, and the contract is going to tender this month. Hampshire County Council wishes to support home working and benefit the carbon footprint with this initiative. Once the contractor has been appointed, we should be able to confirm if Mottisfont and Dunbridge will benefit from the project.

Community Speed Watch

At our December meeting PCSO Jo Cole discussed a Community Speed Watch scheme where local volunteers are provided with various pieces of equipment which will detect the speed of traffic. Details of drivers exceeding the speed limit will then be passed to the Police and warning letters will be sent out. The council discussed the scheme further at this meeting and do have concerns for getting and sustaining volunteers. The equipment is also

Bogus Traders are currently telephoning residents in the New Forest area of Hampshire claiming to be from Trading Standards and are offering to inspect loft spaces to see if the householder will qualify for free loft insulation.

Trading Standards does not offer this service, so residents should be cautious and report any such incidents to Hampshire County Council's Quick Response Team on 01962 833666.

Trading Standards advises consumers not to agree to any work that is instigated as a result of a cold call or via a leaflet drop. Consumers should obtain at least 3 written quotations from reputable businesses or traders who are either members of the Hampshire County Council Trading Standards Buy With Confidence Scheme or a recognised trade association.

Members of the Buy With Confidence scheme are fully audited to ensure their trading practices are legal, honest and fair. All members have been checked for trustworthiness and compliance with consumer protection laws.

For Group Hire the charge has remained at £1.60 per mile.

Dear Friends,

Spring is on the way! Although there's a bitterly cold wind blowing and the odd snow flurry is still about, there are also signs of new life all around us as snowdrops appear, bulbs are peeking through the soggy earth and trees are beginning to bud.


INTERNET 'POP-UP' ADVERTISING

Some pop-ups will include a link to less scrupulous sites offering certain types of downloaded content, such as images or free music, software installation, access to pornographic sites, and gambling sites.

KIMBRIDGE RESTAURANT

Herb crumbed salmon with a roasted tomato and pepper sauce

This recipe serves four.

Ingredients

4 salmon portions, 6-7oz each
150g cream cheese
250g wholegrain breadcrumbs
2 tablespoons of chives, roughly
chopped
2 tablespoons of parsley, roughly
chopped
2 tablespoons of coriander, roughly
chopped
1 clove of finely crushed garlic
grated rind of half a lemon
60g lemon juice

For the sauce:

- 3 peppers
- 1 small onion
- 2 tablespoons of oil
- 2 cloves of crushed garlic
- 1 can of chopped tomatoes

How to make it

Season the salmon fillets lightly on both sides with salt and pepper. Place them skin side down on an oven tray lined with baking paper.

Process all the other ingredients in a food processor until combined and chopped.

Spread each salmon portion with a layer of the cream cheese and put the breadcrumb mixture on top of the salmon fillets, pressing down on top, and cook for 10 to 15 minutes at 180°C (160°C fan) /350°F/Gas Mark 4 until just cooked.

While the salmon is cooking, make the sauce: roast the peppers over a gas flame or under a grill until they are black. Place the peppers in a paper bag to sweat, and once cool peel off the charred skins and remove the seeds. Then roughly chop the peppers and leave to one side.

In a large saucepan heat the oil, add the onion and garlic, and cook for 2-3 minutes or until soft. Add the peppers and the tomatoes, and cook for 10 minutes over a low heat. Puree the sauce using a food processer or stick blender until smooth. Strain through a sieve to remove any seeds and return to a clean pan. Gently heat and season if needed.

Once the sauce is hot, pour some sauce onto each plate and place the cooked salmon on top of the sauce. Serve with a wedge of lemon.
