That Abbey comes to this Abbey...

Followers of the ITV series *Downton Abbey* will no doubt be disappointed by the recent announcement that the forthcoming series will be its last.

However, due to essential maintenance work at Highclere Castle in North Hampshire where the series has been filmed, the production company has settled on Mottisfont Abbey as an alternative location for some of the indoor scenes. "Furthermore," said a representative, "we will be needing a number of extras for a party scene. We'd like to encourage local people to apply. Superfast broadband: don't hold your breath!

Many households in Mottisfont and Dunbridge scrape along with just a few megabits per second of broadband, barely enough to watch BBC iPlayer.

This is doubly annoying when seen in the light of the national average broadband bit rate: 23Mbit/s!

The technical reason for our rather meagre service is that we are quite a long distance from the telephone exchange in Lockerley that serves us. At present, broadband comes down our phone lines, all the way from the exchange, and the distance means that the lines cannot handle high data rates.

The solution will be to provide a fibre optic connection from the Lockerley exchange to street cabinets in Mottisfont and Dunbridge. Optical fibres can carry extremely high data rates over long distances. The data will still arrive at our homes over phone lines, but it will have travelled over them only from the street cabinets, so will be able to achieve much higher data rates.

Hampshire County Council is running a £28.4m programme to provide high speed broadband, but Mottisfont and Dunbridge is in Wave 2, which runs from 2016 to mid-2019. Completion of Wave 2 should make superfast broadband available to at least 95% of premises in Hampshire. At present, information is not precise about when we will get the new service. More detailed information is promised by September this year.

The web site at www.hampshiresuperfastbroadband.com gives a lot of useful information, and a facility to register interest. Sadly the number of households who have registered in our area is reported to be just four! Raising the number might possibly influence the date of installation, so if you are interested in having a modern broadband service in the parish, please make sure you have registered your interest!

Mational Trust

Every year we commission a bird survey across the estate, which is completed by one of our volunteers. This year's report tells us that we have a total of 85 species recorded over the last 12 months, which included six on Schedule 1 of the Wildlife & Countryside Act 1981 as amended under the CRoW Act 2000. These include Red Kite, Northern Goshawk (sadly no breeding pairs), Barn Owl, Common Kingfisher and Tawny Owl (not Schedule 1 species).

Readers might also be interested to know about the other wildlife recorded on the estate over the last 12 months, which includes: bank vole, barbastelle bat (one of the rarest bats in Europe), hare, harvest mouse, shrew, stoat, vole, water vole, weasel and wood mouse.

Please let us know if you would like a copy of the full report, which describes all of the species of birds on the estate, and lists butterflies and insects too. We have a separate report for northern commons of the New Forest, which is available too. We are delighted to report that we now have over 22 European nightjars at Foxbury, which represents over 20% of the entire nightjar population of the New Forest - an incredible achievement. Future of Mottisfont & Dunbridge Station Yard

I am aware that the land owner (Mr Bullivant) has recently spoken about this to a couple of people in Dunbridge and I thought it would be helpful to comment, as there may be some concerns: Many residents who were living here (particularly in Dunbridge) in 2004 will remember that, at the end of the Annual Parish Meeting, Mr Ian Bullivant and Mr Neil Beasley (Architect) introduced their proposal for a development on this land. The main part was for a number of small terraced houses, grouped around a green area open to the road echoing the green at Mill Rise and there were also additional houses, some with attached workshops and parking areas. If I remember correctly, the plans received general approval and a number of useful suggestions were made at the meeting. They then had a pre-planning meeting with TVBC, who didn't like the 'village green' layout with houses at right angles to the railway (which we generally preferred) and advised him not to submit plans in that form. Unfortunately, I think there was a general downturn in house building, so he didn't take this any further at that time.

You will probably be aware that TVBC now has a large quota to meet on new housing, so it is not surprising that this project is likely to be resurrected now, but obviously in a format that should meet TVBC approval. I have seen the new concept drawings and spotted an important detail (missed in 2004) that could provide extra parking at the station

at minimal cost (very important) and, in addition, would also provide a better site layout. Therefore, the project has effectively gone back to the drawing board, and as the final plans will be very different, there is obviously no point having a public presentation (as in 2004) any time soon, as the 'important detail' involves negotiating with Network Rail, which could take some time. The parish council has not discussed this and our view is that there would need to be a public presentation, as in 2004 before we form a view.

One final point on station car parking: The Three Rivers Partnership, who runs our local rail services, has wanted extra parking at the station and one suggestion has been to purchase some land from Mr Bullivant. However, this would be very expensive and would inevitably result in pay parking at the station and if you want an object lesson of how bad that would be for Dunbridge, go to Grateley Station and see how much of the surrounding area is double yellow lined (their on-line PC minutes over the last two years are also very enlightening, as this is still an on-going issue there!).



Recipe of the month: Banana bread

This recipe makes two 2lb loaves.

Ingredients

- 400g butter
- 1 cup light brown sugar
- 1 cup caster sugar
- 4 eggs
- 6 bananas
- 4 cups self-raising flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 2 teaspoons vanilla essence

How to make it

For best results, freeze the bananas two days prior to

making, then take them out of the freezer the night before to defrost. Make sure to place the bananas on a plate, as they will weep when defrosting. If you are unable to freeze the bananas, just use over-ripe ones and mash them well.

Pre-heat the oven to 180°C (160°C fan)/350°F/ Gas Mark 4. Grease and line two 2lb loaf tins with baking parchment.

With an electric whisk, cream together the butter, the two sugars and the vanilla essence until pale and fluffy. Add the eggs and beat in well. Add the mashed banana if using fresh, or if using frozen cut a slit in the skin and scrape out all the banana. (It should be very soft.) Once thoroughly mixed, slowly add the flour and the baking powder and mix in til smooth.

Split the mix evenly between the two lined tins and place in the oven. Cook for 25-30 minutes. Once cold, slice the banana bread and serve with butter.
