The river margins are protected areas of Special Scientific Interest, so we request everyone to observe certain necessary restrictions. Please do not:

- Paddle, swim, or use boats or inflatables
- Leave litter
- Light fires
- Fish
- Drive on to the beats

Dogs are permitted, but due to the wildlife habitats they must be kept on a lead and not allowed in the river.

The National Trust's Mottisfont River-keeper, Neil Swift, will be giving a talk about the river ecosystem and river management. Please come to the Oakley Hut at 12 noon on Sunday, 23rd August. If you have a query about the River Open Day, please email river@mottisfont.org.uk.

BISHOP JACKSON VISITS ROMSEY DEANERY

The link between Romsey Deanery and the Diocese of South Rwenzori, Uganda, was established more than 25 years ago. Each year Romsey Deanery Overseas Mission Committee sends between £12,000 and £15,000 to support schooling for orphans, training in carpentry and sewing skills, and growing of trees to help stabilize the deforested hill slopes. RDOMC sponsors visits to the UK by key Ugandan workers, and in October Bishop Jackson and his wife Dorothy will be here.

Bishop Jackson and his wife Dorothy will be the guests of Romsey Deanery from Monday, 12th October until Saturday, 17th October. We hope to have the opportunity to hear Bishop Jackson speak of the challenges he faces, and on various sponsored projects. A provisional programme is being drawn up.

MEDITATIONS AT BOSSINGTON

Preparations continue for the opening night of a series of three meditations at Bossington, starting at 6pm on Sunday, 20th September.

The first event will be about Amy Carmichael, a missionary in South India, who founded a settlement there which still operates. The second will be about lan Ramsey, who came from humble upbringing to be Bishop of Durham and died from overwork before he could become Archbishop of Canterbury. The third will be about William Vanstone, problably the most brilliant theologian of his day, who lived most of his life in a parish in Rochdale. He became an Archdeacon but heart disease prevented him from rising higher.

Solent Credit Union

Credit Unions are not-for-profit organisations which are owned and run by their members. They offer safe savings accounts and the opportunity for members to borrow at affordable interest rates. In the UK there are over 350 credit unions serving a total of well over a million members. They are regulated under similar terms to banks and building societies so savers' deposits are protected up to £85,000 by the financial services compensation scheme.

Each credit union will serve members who have something in common. This "common bond" may be that they live in a particular area or that they are members of a specific profession. Credit Unions, along with debt advice services, financial education and school savings clubs, feature in #TOYOURCREDIT (toyourcredit.org.uk) which is the Archbishop of Canterbury's initiative to create a fairer financial system focused on serving the whole community, where everyone has access to responsible credit and savings and other essential financial services.

Locally, Solent Credit Union serves those who live or work within the SO postcode area. The main office is in Southampton, but there are local Member Service Points typically open for an hour or two one day a week. Solent's Member Service Point in Romsey is on a Friday from 10am to 11am and has been in the United Reformed Church Hall, but will be moving to the Former Magistrates Court starting on Friday, 7th August.

Solent Credit Union is always looking for volunteers, including some additional volunteers to assist at the Romsey Member Service Point. Volunteers should be able to give something to the Credit Union in time and knowledge, and in return they will be given the opportunity to learn and give benefits to Solent Credit Union members. 
We are happy to be able to offer the

KIMBRIDGE RESTAURANT

Lime cheesecake

This recipe serves 8 people.

Ingredients

4 limes, zest and juice
400g full fat soft cheese
1½ packets of digestive biscuits
50g melted butter
100g double cream

How to make it Grease and line an 8 inch loosebottomed tin.

Put the digestives in a blender and blitz, or put the biscuits in a sealed plastic bag and hit with a rolling pin until all broken up.

Melt the butter and mix the crushed biscuits and butter together. Put an even layer of the mixture in the bottom of the tin, and then put the tin in the fridge to chill while making the filling.

Put the cream cheese into a mixer and mix until soft. Add the cream to loosen the cheese. Once thoroughly mixed, add the lime juice and zest. Gently combine the two. If not sweet enough, add a little icing sugar.



Retrieve the base from the fridge and spoon the cheesecake mix onto the top of the base. Knock it gently on the table so that any air at the bottom of the tin is removed. Then put the cheesecake back into the fridge and chill over night.

For the best appearance, remove the chilled cheesecake from the tin, and discard the paper lining. Cut the cheesecake with a hot clean knife, wiping the knife each time so you get a clean cut.
