It looks like the completion of the building will be some time towards the end of the year, and will be open to the public in the New Year. TEST VALLEY LECTURE 'The Future of our Woodlands' by Prof. Julian Evans, OBE, Wednesday, 15th July

How sure can we be that our trees and woods have a sustainable future? Prof. Julian Evans will look at the issues, both old and new: traditional coppicing and pollarding, new alternatives to clear-felling known as continuous cover forestry, what we know about the nutrient demands that trees and forests make, and how all this links to biodiversity. He will also address pest and disease threats, climate change and what protections are in place to ensure that the woods we love can't simply be cleared away by development.

Julian Evans, OBE, is one of the country's most eminent foresters, formerly Professor of Forestry at Imperial College, Chief Research Officer at the Forestry Commission and President of the Institute of Chartered Foresters.

River Open Day: An Invitation to Local Residents

The National Trust and Mottisfont Fly-Fishing Club are pleased to invite residents of Mottisfont and Dunbridge to enjoy the beautiful riverbanks of the Oakley, Rectory and Dun beats on Sunday 23rd August. This is during the August weed-cut period when the rivers are not fished, and so can be opened to local residents. You are welcome to picnic, walk, observe the wildlife and enjoy the riverbanks from 9am until 7pm.

The river margins are protected areas of Special Scientific Interest, so we request everyone to observe certain necessary restrictions. Please do not:

- · Paddle, swim, or use boats or inflatables
- Leave litter
- Light fires
- Fish
- Drive on to the beats

Dogs are permitted, but due to the wildlife habitats they must be kept on a lead and not allowed in the river.

Access:

Dun Beat: by the bridge opposite the layby on Hatt Hill.

Rectory Beat: from the road between the main Abbey Car Park and Mottisfont House. Oakley Beat: by the bridge on Oakley Lane.

The Mottisfont River-keeper, Neil Swift, will be giving a talk about the river ecosystem and river management. Please come to the Oakley Hut at 12 noon on Sunday 23rd August. All are welcome.

Parking spaces near the beats are quite limited, so please walk to the rivers if possible.

- Remove sat nav holders and remove visible suction cup ring marks from the window screen.

- Leave the glove box open to show there's nothing inside.
- Fit an alarm or immobiliser to your car.
- Do not store your car documents in the car.
- Secure your wheels by using locking wheel locks.
- Be aware who is around you when leaving your car
- Call 101 if you see anyone acting in a suspicious manner or 999 if a crime is taking place.

Asparagus and feta tartlet

A nice light summery meal and a great complement for any summer salads or as a side dish for a barbecues.

This recipe serves four.

Ingredients

250g block of puff pastry 200g feta cheese 80g grated parmesan 1 lemon rind finely grated 20 asparagus spears Olive oil for dressing

How to make it

Pre heat the oven to 180C Restaurant fan/gas 6/200C. Line a baking tray with parchment paper to prevent the pastry sticking to the tray.



Trim the asparagus into lengths of no more than about 10cm and place on a baking tray. Drizzle with a little olive oil, sprinkle with lemon rind, and place in the oven for 10 minutes until the asparagus has softened.

Roll out the pastry, cut into rectangles about 12x6cm and place on the lined baking tray. Score a 1cm border on each rectangle.

Sprinkle parmesan over the central rectangles, then add about five of the trimmed and softened asparagus spears to each base. Finally, crumble the feta carefully over the asparagus. Avoid any of these ingredients getting onto the pastry border.

Brush the pastry borders with olive oil and cook in the oven for 15 minutes, or until the pastry has puffed up and is golden brown. Serve warm with salad or as a side dish with a summer barbecue.
