Well, it's both a surprise and an honour to be writing to you. I don't think any of us were expecting Paul to be moving on, probably including Paul himself but restoring Clandon is such an important job, and we know he'll do it brilliantly.

I'm thrilled to have been asked to lead the Mottisfont and South West Hampshire teams going

forwards. This is a place that I love – I've been part of the senior team here for the last 6 years, as Visitor Experience Manager. My background before that was in museum and gallery learning (I worked at the National Gallery for a number of years), and as a university lecturer. I was also lucky enough to take part in the Clore Leadership Programme, which enabled me to do all sorts of business study, research and secondments in different organisations. The National Trust has asked me to be General Manager for 6 months initially; if it's working well, I very much hope I'll be the right candidate long term.

I'm sorry that one of the first things I need to do is to apologise for the difficulties with traffic congestion on Good Friday. The weather (and the dire forecast) meant that we had unprecedented numbers of visitors. Both car parks became full; we closed the gates and asked people to leave rather than queuing and blocking access to the village, but some of them were reluctant to move on. I will be talking to our local police team to get their advice on how to avoid this and what is best practice in such circumstances. By June, we should have the water meadow available for parking, so this should not be an issue, but I do apologise for Good Friday.

Trials, tribulations, and tributes: The work of a junior doctor in cancer research

Speaker: Dr. Siân Pugh

Siân Pugh is a junior doctor and Medical Research Council clinical research fellow working at the University of Southampton. Her interest in research was sparked during her undergraduate years and since then she has been committed to becoming a clinician scientist. During her training as a junior doctor Siân has been fortunate to obtain both academic and clinical fellowship positions which have allowed her to pursue her research interests alongside her clinical training. Currently she is undertaking a PhD, supported by a clinical research training fellowship from the MRC.

During an evening of talk and conversation, Siân will tell her personal story as a junior doctor undertaking cancer research. This will include the highs and lows of undertaking clinical trials, why research should be part of every doctor's job, and her personal views on the move towards precision cancer medicine. At a time of much media interest in junior doctors and turbulence in the NHS, Siân will give her thoughts on returning to the NHS to complete her clinical training.

REVISING THE PARISH PLAN

TVBC has started an initiative to involve local communities in the process of creating or updating their own local planning statements. Since our Parish Plan was written in 2009 it is now in need of review and update. Parish Plans are intended to outline issues that are important to local residents and that will influence future neighbourhood planning. Typically the plans cover road and transport subjects, community facilities and events, housing and planning matters, environmental, local landscape and open space issues. Such plans are important as they may be used to ensure local concerns and characteristics are taken into account before local planning authority decisions are made.

The Government and local authority recommended course of action for Parish Plans is that they should be created by members of the community and be subject

to widespread and effective community involvement.

Local parish councils such as Lockerley, East Dean, East and West Tytherley are also considering their Parish Plans and, as there is some common areas of interest between our parishes, there may be some value in considering each other's proposals.

It is important that our revised Parish Plan represents, as far as possible, the views of the entire parish so a first meeting to get the ball rolling will be held at the **Mill Arms on Tuesday 17th May at 7.30pm**. Please make a note in your diary and come along.

KIMBRIDGE RESTAURANT

Chicken breast with a wild mushroom, pancetta and tarragon cream

Some flavours are just natural matches: chicken and tarragon, cream and mushrooms, and the four combined are delicious!

This recipe serves 4 people.

Ingredients

100g diced pancetta 1 tablespoon olive oil 2 cloves garlic, crushed 30g wild mushrooms

2 teaspoons butter

4 chicken breasts

250ml chicken stock

300ml double cream
1 tablespoon fresh chopped tarragon

How to make it

Clean and chop the mushrooms and leave to one side. Put the olive oil, garlic, panectta and thyme into a pan with a teaspoon of butter. Season the chicken breasts, add them to the pan and cook both sides of the breasts until they start to colour nicely.

Add the chicken stock and simmer for 15 minutes until the chicken is cooked. Remove the chicken breasts and leave to rest on a warm plate.

Reserve any liquid from the pan and sauté the mushrooms in a teaspoon of butter. Add the cream, simmer until it reduces by half, and then add the chicken and any remaining stock.

Serve garnished with the tarragon.
