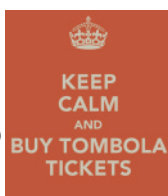

Dear friends and neighbours,

We had a successful rose season despite the heat-wave that developed towards the end of the month – though the plants, trees and lawns could really do with some rain now, as could the rivers and streams.

This rose season, we tried a new system of filtering members coming down Bengers Lane straight into the north paddock overflow car park from the start of the day, which eased the traffic flow considerably and lessened the number of vehicles coming through the village. One advantage of the dry weather is that the lower overflow next to our main car park is now able to be used, so if it's needed during the summer holidays, we'll be able to take people straight into there.

If you have little ones around over the next couple of months, or if you have happy memories of reading stories of Mog the cat or the Tiger who Came to Tea, do pop in to see the new exhibition in the gallery.

There are wonderful illustrations by the author and artist Judith Kerr, and a fantastic little play kitchen for our younger visitors, complete with a giant cuddly tiger for photo opportunities! As usual, there's a trail around the grounds as well.

There have been some reports of anti-social behaviour in Spearywell Woods, with people riding on motorbikes along the tracks. They have been reported to the police, and National Trust rangers are also on the look-out for this behaviour. We are also speaking to neighbouring land-owners who have experienced similar problems, to see if there's anything more we can do to prevent this.

With the temperatures currently soaring so high, we would be very grateful if everyone could be vigilant about discarded rubbish or fly-tipping, particularly

anything involving glass bottles or reflective materials, to minimise the fire risk. If it's a piece of rubbish, we'd really appreciate it being collected and disposed of by anyone seeing it; for significant fly-tips, please as always let the estate office know at Mottisfont, on 344001.

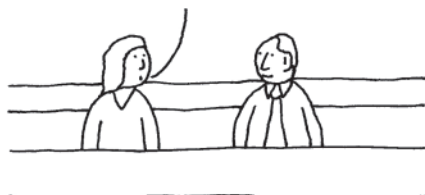

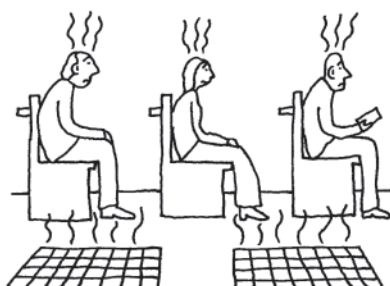

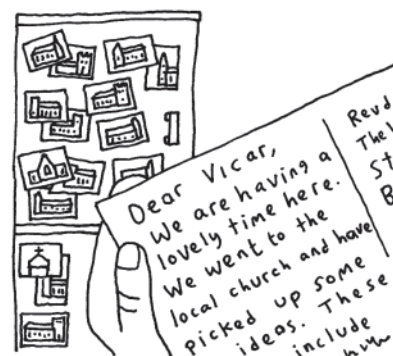

River Open Day An Invitation to Local Residents

Mottisfont Fly-Fishing Club and the National Trust are pleased to invite residents of Mottisfont and Dunbridge to enjoy the beautiful riverbanks of the Oakley, Rectory and Dun beats on Sunday 26th August. This is during the August weed-cut period when the rivers are not fished, and so can be opened to local residents. You are welcome to picnic, walk, observe the wildlife and enjoy the riverbanks from 9am until 6pm.

The river margins are protected areas of Special Scientific Interest, so we request everyone to observe certain necessary restrictions. Please do not:

- Paddle, swim, or use boats or inflatables
- Leave litter
- Light fires
- Fish
- Drive on to the beats

Dogs are permitted, but due to the wildlife habitats they must be kept on a lead and not allowed in the river.

Access

- Dun Beat: by the bridge opposite the layby on Hatt Hill.
- Rectory Beat: from the road between the main Abbey Car Park and Mottisfont House.
- Oakley Beat: by the bridge on Oakley Lane.

The Mottisfont River-keeper, Neil Swift, will be giving a talk about the river ecosystem and river management. Please come to the Oakley Hut at 12 noon on Sunday 26th August.

Parking spaces near the beats are limited, so please walk to the rivers if possible.

More Internet Scams

Hampshire Alert has recently sent out warnings about two scams:

Argos

People have been receiving texts purporting to be from Argos and stating that you are owed a refund. If you click on the link in the text, it takes you to a fake web site that is designed to look like it is run by Argos, but is actually operated by the scammers, and is designed to steal your log-in details.

Amazon

There has been an increase in the number of fake Amazon emails. Similarly to the fake Argos texts, if you click on a link in the email, it will take you to a fake site that looks like an Amazon log-in page, but is actually there to steal your log-in details.

As Hampshire Alert says: "***Always question unsolicited requests for your personal or financial information in case it's a scam. Never automatically click on a link in an unexpected email or text.***"

Do you know that the text of a link (usually appearing in blue and underlined) can be completely different from the link itself? Sometimes scammers will put a link into an email that looks something like:

"...please log in to your account at www.my-bank.com"

but the link actually takes you to the scammers' page, such as www.definitely-not-my-bank.com/.

There is a simple way to check the actual destination of a link, without going there. Just position the cursor over the link **but do NOT click it**. Somewhere at the bottom of the window should appear the actual link destination; if this does not look like the site you are expecting to go to, then it's almost certainly a scam. (This should work with most email and web browser software.) But beware: some scammers get clever and set up a working link along the following lines:

[www.my-bank.com.some-random-characters.definitely-not-my-bank.com/...](http://www.my-bank.com.some-random-characters.definitely-not-my-bank.com/)

The first part is meant to convince you that you are on my-bank's site, but in reality you are on definitely-not-my-bank! The trick is to look for the "/" character, and then examine what's immediately before it.

This may all seem a bit complicated, and if so, just stick to the simple rule: ***never click on a link in an unexpected email or text.***
