Nationa Trust Hello everyone,

As I write, the snowdrops are already looking very pretty around the grounds and in the woods, and a new exhibition of cartoons and local landscapes by Norman Thelwell is making the visitors chuckle – just what we need at the moment! A highlight for me is the

Thelwell pony rocking horse, one of only ten made, who has been set up in his own little 'paddock' in the gallery.

The gardeners are part way through the mammoth task of pruning all the roses in the walled garden. They had a new apprentice with them last week, as you'll see from the picture attached. I was let loose on a nice straight rugosa as my 'starter' rose and given expert tuition. It was really interesting and I learned lots; however, I think I am possibly the slowest pruner they have ever had! We're looking forward to seeing the benefits of everyone's work this summer.



On the estate, our woodland management plans are progressing well through the winter. In accordance with our Countryside Stewardship agreement, we are doing some tree felling to open up rides and coppiced areas. Tree surgeons will be finishing tree safety works over the next few weeks. Please do keep to the footpaths when you're out walking – you'll always see a sign if someone is working on tree management nearby.

On the river, we've had permission from the Environment Agency to repair and restore the main fishing hut. Sparsholt College have been surveying the

fish, and we're looking forward to hearing their findings, which will feed into our management plans.

You may have noticed that there's some building work going on in the Stables at the moment. The front of the building was showing signs of movement, so it's being anchored in. We're also replacing some beams where previous water leaks had caused problems. There's another beam in the house that needs to be replaced, which is a more complex job: the surveyors are scoping out the possibilities now. Such are the joys of looking after historic properties – but we like a challenge, and we'll find a solution.

Hope you can get out for a spring walk when it's not too cold.

Thelwell: Laughter and Landscapes Saturday 5 January – Monday 22 April

A welcome return to the world of Norman Thelwell. There are old favourites on show, including the antics of iconic characters Penelope and her mischievous pony, Kipper. The exhibition also includes other satirical cartoons, with astute and amusing observations on country life, and breathtaking landscape art. Some of this work has never been publically shown before, including a selection of Thelwell's early sketches.

February half term: Country Capers Saturday 16 – Sunday 24 February

Explore the grounds with a half-term activity trail, full of mischievous activities inspired by Thelwell's love of the countryside. The exhibition includes child-friendly labels, too.

In the gardens...

This is the perfect season to see our winter garden at its best, full of bright colours which really stand out on frosty mornings. Delicate white clusters of our native snowdrop, galanthus nivalis, emerge around the grounds, especially along the font stream and at the start of the river walk, where a woodchip path meanders through an ancient buxus plantation on the banks. Over 16,000 snowdrops were planted for the 2018 display and will bloom again in 2019.

In the house...

The winter is a busy time for our house team, who are busy working on the annual deep clean. You'll be able to get up close to some of this conservation work when you visit. Look out for the team using a huge array of interesting equipment to make sure our rooms are looking their best for the year; they'll be

These include thinning operations to allow the remaining trees to grow to maturity, and the felling of trees to improve light conditions along our ride networks to improve wildlife habitats. A Life in Crime

Speaker: Judge Christopher Lee QC

Christopher Lee spent his working life as a barrister in the criminal courts in Hampshire. He then worked all over the country as a Q.C., before returning to Hampshire when he was made a circuit judge.

He will talk about some of the cases he prosecuted, defended and tried as well as touching on some of the wider issues facing the criminal justice system today. These include whether judges are out of touch, and whether the police are worthy of our trust.

LENGTHSMAN WANTED

Stockbridge Parish Council is looking for a Parish Lengthsman to carry out routine maintenance work across 15 parishes in the Test Valley. The work will take roughly 60 hours per month but as much of the tasks are weather dependent it will not be spread evenly across the year.

The role of the Lengthsmen is to do everything necessary to improve the environment within the local communities and to keep their parishes up to scratch, forming a close relationship with the parishes and an awareness of their needs. The work is outdoor and varied, ranging from sweeping footpaths to clearing grips.

The Lengthsman is required to provide transport, mobile telephone and tools necessary to carry out their duties. The scheme is funded by Hampshire County Council and administered by Stockbridge Parish Council.

All three have been the subject of films. Maybe you have seen them, and would like to know more about them - and there is a lot more to know! We will publish the names of the films next month, together with news of a competition.




We are always looking for additional volunteer drivers.
