A Nutcracker Christmas at Mottisfont 23rd November - 5th January (closed 24th & 25th December)

Step into the enchanting world of The Nutcracker this Christmas. Inspired by the beloved ballet, your journey begins at our Box Office, where you'll collect your timed ticket to immerse yourself in this magical tale. Wander through sparkling rooms adorned with twinkling trees, captivating music, and dazzling details that bring the story to life. Outside in the gardens, take part in our Nutcracker themed adventure trail filled with surprises for all ages, making every corner a delight to explore.

Entry: Normal property admission price (free for Parish & Tennant Pass holders, National Trust members, Art Fund members and under-fives).

Timed tickets: To ensure a smooth and enjoyable experience for all visitors during the festive season, we will be operating a timed ticket system for House visits only to avoid overcrowding on busy days.

How to get a ticket on the day: To visit the Nutcracker-themed Christmas inside the House, it's essential to pick up a timed ticket from Visitor Reception upon arrival. These tickets apply only to the house, and do not apply to the car park, gardens

or family trail. The tickets are available from 10am on the day you visit. No pre-booking is required. The house opens at 10:30am, with the last entry at 3pm. The Visitor Welcome team will assign you the next available time slot on arrival at Visitor Reception, which you hand in to the House team when it's your time slot to enter the house. We've designed the ticketing structure to ensure there are enough tickets for everyone to enjoy the festive displays inside the house throughout the day.

Visiting the house: Please arrive at the house entrance within the half-hour time slot stated on your ticket. This helps us ensure a smooth flow of visitors, and avoid congestion or delays for others.

Romsey Abbey Choir – 14th December, 12 noon to 1.30pm

Come and join in with the festive spirit on Saturday 14th December as we welcome the Romsey Abbey Choir for the first time at Mottisfont, who will be singing carols in the Stables courtyard.

National Trust Trees & Storms Update

Our team have the responsibility and challenge of managing the National Trust tree stock across the South West Hants Portfolio. Many of the trees are within or close to property boundaries, along highways and pubic rights of way. With an increase in storm frequency, as well as other biotic and abiotic factors, trees are experiencing a growing number of stresses. These factors can lead to them losing branches or failing at base, which on occasion can block roads and impact access.

The National Trust has a detailed approach to managing tree safety. We routinely undertake tree surveys to assess for defects and hazards, where necessary judging any risk control measures that may be needed and

managing any remedial works. A key element of our tree safety policy is ensuring that any management is proportionate, working to strike a balance between possible risks and the benefits trees provide.

If trees do become unstable or wind blown during or after storm conditions, and you believe them to be under our ownership, it's important that you report them to us. You can do that by contacting our main office: Mottisfont@nationaltrust.org.uk, 01794 340757. If you are a National Trust tenant you can also contact the Tenant Repairs & Compliance Team.

For staff safety we cannot attend site during storm conditions, but we will respond as soon we are able. Any trees blocking the roads should be reported to Hampshire Highways by calling 0300 5551388 (8.30am to 5pm) or 101 if out of hours. If you believe it poses an immediate risk to public safety you can call 999.

Our Sunday Roasts continue to be extremely popular, and we are now regularly fully booked for the full Sunday service, so please make sure that you phone early enough in the week to make a reservation. Our Loyalty Card scheme also continues to be a favourite with customers, and we are now close to 700 members who not only enjoy discount but also free meals for birthdays, and wine on the house for anniversaries. If you haven't signed up, then do ask next time you are in.

We continue to host the Tytherley Skittles League, Hampshire Sheep Farmers and Hursley Pony Club on a regular basis, along with many family celebrations for birthday and christenings, and other local groups that now use as us their venue of choice for gatherings.
