Romsey: Fridays - now includes Awbridge Salisbury: Tuesdays and 2nd Wednesdays


Southampton: 1st Wednesdays





News from Test Valley Borough Council ("TVBC")

There is much news and change in local government – some good and some less good – so we thought residents may appreciate an update.

Starting with the good news, we are lucky to have so many volunteers in Mid Test willing to give their time, energy and effort to improving our community. We have made it a priority since being elected in May 2023, to promote local community projects with grants and other support where we can. We are delighted that so many projects have come forward and been successful in securing funding through the various grants administered by TVBC. Projects include new sports pavilions, community bus initiative, business hub, renovation of community buildings, new defibrillators, support for local community shops, and much more.

Smaller grants, of up to £1,000 are available through the Community Councillor Grant scheme. And in addition, grants of up to £500 are currently available to support communities who wish to celebrate the 80th anniversary of VE day.

Due to limited space in this edition, we hope to provide an update on changes to national planning targets and devolution and local government reorganisation next month. As a preview:

On planning: You might have noticed publicity about new housing targets for councils announced by Angela Rayner last autumn. Test Valley's housing target is to be increased by a staggering 78%...

On devolution and local govt reorganisation: Just before Christmas the government published a White Paper setting out their plans for devolution and whole scale local government reorganisation. In Hampshire, that means an elected Mayor and the creation of new unitary authorities that are responsible for most local services...
